Therefore, in my opinion, raising the prices of these drinks is a more effective method on for reducing problems caused by "sugary-heavy" beverages.

However, it is my belief that sports drinks should be excluded from price-raisingsuch reforms/policy shifts, since they serve to preserve, not damage__athletes'_health. Energy drinks, for example, Mizone and Red_-Bull, are a crucial part of athletes' daily diets in <u>countries such as</u> China, since they can efficiently replenish sugar, water, and energy levels in the athletes' systems, after intense training. For example, at the recent Olympic games in Tokyo, the athletes were supplied with a variety of energy drinks as a means of replenishing critical electrolyyes between competitions. As tThey do not pose as a_a_threat to human health, for this reason, their prices should not be raised.

In summary, most beverages containing high sugar levels should be priced higher, since they are the <u>dominant</u> cause for <u>of</u> many <u>contemporary</u> dominant health issues today</u>.
