In contemporary society, some people claim that a fixed punishment should be assigned to each kind of crime, while others hold the opinion that specific conditions and motivations should be taken into consideration. From my point of view, there are good reasons for both claims, but I would agree with the latter.

In terms of the former claim, it is undeniable that having fixed punishments to—for each form of crime is beneficial to make the sanction to be makes law impartial. Moreover, it also helps prevent judgements from being influenced by emotions like compassion for the guilty. Therefore, setting fixed rules for judgements and punishments is a workable way to ensure impartiality.

However, fixed punishments without considering the specific situations and a criminal's motivations can barely be are often unfair. This is because the extent of guiltiness guilt can vary from person to person. For instance, there should be a different punishment for a man who kills a person by a mistake from a murderer who kill a person by deliberation commits deliberate and premeditate homicide, as the former do not mean to disobey the law and do harm to the society. If that person kills someone by mistake who is intending to attack him or her, it would even be much less serious, because the action could can be considered as a self-defense. With regard to these differences mentioned, it is reasonable for us to compare the motivation and condition, otherwise the punishment can be unfairmay be unjust to some criminals who commit lighter crimes with mitigating circumstances.
